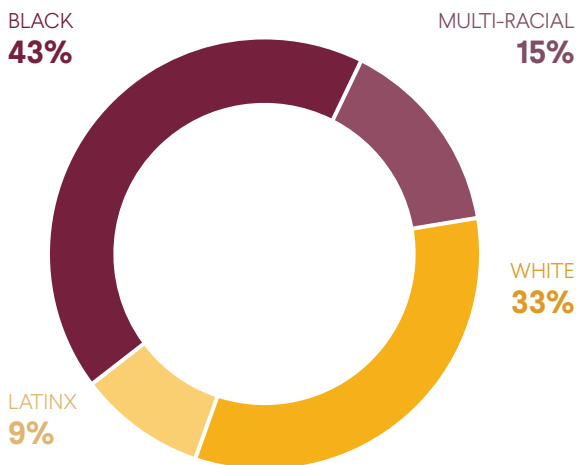

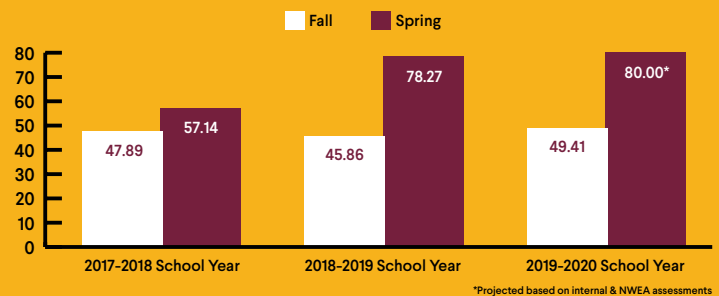

SPONSOR STATEMENT
